

Accessibility for persons with disabilities, to all parts of the church building that are open to the public, is mandated by the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005, (AODA). Accessibility is also part of our Mission as an inclusive community.

We welcome anyone who relies on assistive devices, service animals, or support persons to participate in worship and in our various programs and activities.

If you or someone you accompany to our building has any accessibility needs, you are welcome to make use of any of the devices shown here, or speak with any of our staff or volunteers for assistance.

Accessibility devices on site include:

A **Ramp** at the Yonge Street entrance provides wheelchair access to the Sanctuary where we hold regular Sunday morning worship services. **Please note** that this entrance is always open on Sunday mornings, but not all through the week. If wheelchair access is needed at other times, let the office know.

Large print service programs are available at the Yonge Street entrance, from the Greeters.

Earphones are available in the Sanctuary. A Greeter or Usher can assist you.

An **Accessible washroom** can be reached from the Sanctuary, through the door to the left of the choir loft.

The **Lift** in Centennial Hall provides access to the church office, staff offices, a kitchen, the chapel, and several meeting rooms.

All **staff and volunteers** who serve the public are trained in the use of assistive devices that may be used by participants with disabilities.

We invite feedback from visitors to the building. A brochure and feedback form are on display at the main entrances.

RHUC has an Accessibility Committee, reporting to Council, which reviews all feedback, makes recommendations for improvement, and follows up with visitors when requested.
